

HELMET & BICYCLE SAFETY

At the end of the 2022-2023 with the help of the local Labrador City Canadian Tire, the Labrador Regional Wellness Coalition was able to purchase a total of 133 helmets ranging in sizes from infant to adult for distribution to communities in our region. Throughout this year with the assistance of community members and groups who graciously agreed to help us we were able to distribute the helmets to individuals in our communities along with some information and promotional items. APPLIED SUICIDE INTERVENTION SKILLS TRAINING

On June 28th and 29th the Labrador Regional Wellness Coalition sponsored 9 individuals to complete the 2-day ASIST interactive workshop at the Labrador Health Centre in Goose Bay. Individuals who completed this training were taught skills that can be helpful in recognizing when someone is having thoughts of suicide and how to help. The coalition would like to extend thank-you to everyone who helped organize this and to the instructors for taking the time to offer this valuable training opportunity. We would also like to thank individuals for their interest in this training and we are currently exploring the possibly of offering additional training opportunities in the future. March is Colon Cancer Awareness Month

About Colon Cancer

- Colon cancer is also known as colorectal or bowel cancer. It is cancer of the wall of the colon or rectum.
- The colon is also called the large intestine or large bowel; it is approximately five to six feet long. The rectum is the last few inches of the colon.
- Colon cancer generally develops from tiny growths called polyps inside the colon or rectum.
- Polyps start out as small harmless growths on the inner wall of the colon. However, as polyps grow larger some may turn into cancer.

Who should have colon screening?

The Colon Cancer Screening Program recommends that all people aged 50 to 74 who are considered at average (normal) risk for colon cancer be screened with a home screening test called the Fecal Immunochemical Test (FIT).

This includes people who:

- have no personal or family history of colon cancer;
- have not had a colonoscopy (the light put up) in the last five years; or are currently scheduled for one; and
- have no personal history of inflammatory colitis or Crohn's disease.

People with a family history of colon cancer might have a higher chance of getting colon cancer. These people and their families who believe they are at a higher risk should speak with their family doctor or other health-care provider about the best test option for them.

Our next grant call application deadline is June 1st, 2024. Going forward yearly grant application deadlines for each fiscal year will be June 1st. September 1st. December 1st and March 1st. The LRWC recommends applying early to ensure that your application can be reviewed and if successful funds can be received before the start of you project.
